

FUNERAL OF THE PRESIDENT.

The Procession on Monday--Order of Chief Marshal--Meetings, Resolutions, &c.

The ceremonies attending the reception of the remains of our murdered President, in Chicago, on Monday morning next, will be of the most imposing and extensive character. The whole city will be one vast place of mourning for the honored dead. A parallel event has never occurred in our national history; and the loss will be mourned more in our city not less than in any other part of the Union. The inclement weather of the day, but those from the surrounding country, will attend the funeral.

RECEIVING THE REMAINS. We have already announced the route of the procession, which will follow the remains from the place of their deposition, from the Court House to the Court House, where they will lie in state till Tuesday night. The whole of the ground to be traversed is being put in thorough order; the streets will be kept perfectly clean along the line of march, and the Court House and Square are being cleared. The inclement weather of the past few days sadly interferes with the progress of the work, but it will be done nevertheless. The avenues to the line of march will be closely guarded, and the following order from the Marshal is being observed: All may be aware of the exclusion to be practiced, and govern themselves accordingly.

This division will approach Michigan avenue, through Harrison street. Right of Second Division will rest on Harrison street, left on Adams street. Organizations will report to Marshal of this division at Adams street, corner Michigan avenue. Right of Third Division will rest on Adams street, left on Washington. Organizations will report to the Marshal at this division corner Adams and Michigan avenue. Right of Fourth Division will rest on Washington street, left on Lake street corner of Wabash avenue. Organizations will report to Marshal, corner of Lake and Wabash. Right of Fifth Division will rest on Lake street, corner of Wabash avenue, left-corner Clark and Randolph. Organizations will report to Marshal at corner of Wabash and Lakes. All general officers and members of the General Staff, present in this city on Monday next, are invited to take a place in the funeral escort, immediately in the rear of, and following, Major General Baker and staff. They will report to Breckinridge Street, in the rear of the military portion of the procession, at Park Row, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon. All officers accepting this invitation will report to Col. Elison, Depot Quartermaster, on Michigan avenue, south of Wabash street, punctually at 9:30 o'clock in the morning.

No one in charge of a society, lodge, or other organization will be allowed on horseback. None in the procession will be mounted except the Marshal. All organizations must report promptly on the ground at 9 o'clock. All organizations which have not reported will have an opportunity of doing so, and have places assigned to them in the procession by reporting to any of the committees on Park Row, at 10 o'clock, before 12 o'clock to-day. Places will be assigned to them in a supplementary order which will be published. No vehicles of any kind will be allowed upon any of the streets occupied by the procession. Tuesday will be set apart for the citizens of Chicago to view the remains in the Court House.

PUBLIC SCHOOL DEPARTMENT.

The Superintendent of Schools, J. L. Pickard, Esq., Assistant Marshal, has had the honor to receive the following: It should be well read by every parent and teacher. The Public Schools will take the place assigned them in the procession to receive the remains of President Lincoln in the following order: 1st. The School on the west side of the street, between Park Place and Harrison street, the right resting on Park Place. 2d. The schools will form in the following order, from the right: On the East side of Michigan: 1-High School, 2-Dearborn, 3-Scammon, 4-Franklin, 5-Mosely, 6-Edwards, 7-Newberry, 8-Sumner, 9-Spink Chicago, 10-Holstein. On the west side of Michigan: 1-Jones School, 2-Kinzie, 3-Washington, 4-Orden, 5-No. Twelve, 6-Hyven, 7-Bridgeport.

The space assigned to each school will be in proportion to the number of pupils enrolled during the month of April. Messrs. Delino, Dewey, Porter, Welles, Gayles and Faulhaber will act as aids in arranging the procession, and will be in attendance at the place of forming to assign each school as it reports itself to the proper place in the procession. The schools will report themselves as early as ten o'clock at the following points: 1st. H. H. School, Jones School, Mosby School, Foster School, Haven School, South Chicago School and Bridgeport School upon Twelfth street. 2d. Kinzie School upon Harmon Court. 3d. Washington School upon Eldridge Court. 4th. Brown and Ogden Schools upon Peck Court. All the other schools will report upon Harrison Street.

Immediately after the passing of the cortège the schools will march under the direction of Col. J. M. Loomis, Marshal of the First Division and his staff. Every precaution has been taken to guard against accident, but all parents who are unwilling to trust their children with their teachers upon that day will please detain them at home. Special facilities have been accorded the schools to visit the Court House, so that they may be readily to return home at an early hour, and yet I would caution all who are unable to endure the fatigue of at least three hours standing and marching after reaching the ground, against attending the funeral. All branches of schools will convene at the main landings instead of their own buildings upon that morning.

Each child is requested to carry a very small flag, and in the hands of the Principals of the Grammar Schools and the male teachers of the High School are requested to meet at the office of the Board of Education at 9 o'clock this (Saturday) afternoon.

The following circular has been issued by the general committee of A. F. & A. M., by authority of the M. W. Grand Master of the State of Illinois, "To all Free and Accepted Masters of Lodges in the city of Chicago and surrounding country." "The untimely death of the President of the United States, and the universal sorrow which has everywhere prevailed, have naturally called upon all classes of the community to manifest their feeling of regret; and from none can such manifestations be expected with more appropriateness than a Fraternity whose principles inculcate loyalty to their country, and a con-

tempt and detestation for the infamous crime which has plunged the nation into mourning. In order to testify our respect to the memory of the honored dead, the Masters of the several Lodges in the city were appointed a committee to make suitable arrangements for taking part in the ceremonies of receiving the remains of our late President. The following programme is fraternally suggested: 1. Lodges need not be opened, but the members of each will assemble at their respective halls at the time appointed. 2. The brethren should observe a uniformity of dress, and a suitable sash, which should be black with black hats, white gloves and aprons, and crapes on the left arm. The evergreen should be omitted. 3. The officers should wear, in addition to the above, a black sash--the Master to carry the gavel covered with crape, secured by white ribbon. 4. Columns and rods to be dispensed with. 5.
