

Scotland Day, August 4, 1893

at the World's Columbian Exposition, Chicago

On this day Scottish costumes and characteristics were prominent in the gathering of the clans at Jackson Park, and the martial spirit of auld Scotia was stirred by the piping of "The Campbells are Coming" and "Scots wha hae wi' Wallace bled."



A reunion was held from ten to twelve in the morning at the New York State Building, after which the clansmen, led by the pipers, marched to Festival Hall, where, at two o'clock, a program of speeches, interspersed with Scottish music and dance, was presented. Daniel R. Goudie, of Chicago, made an eloquent address, and other speakers were the commissioners from Canada, India, Australia, and Ceylon.
