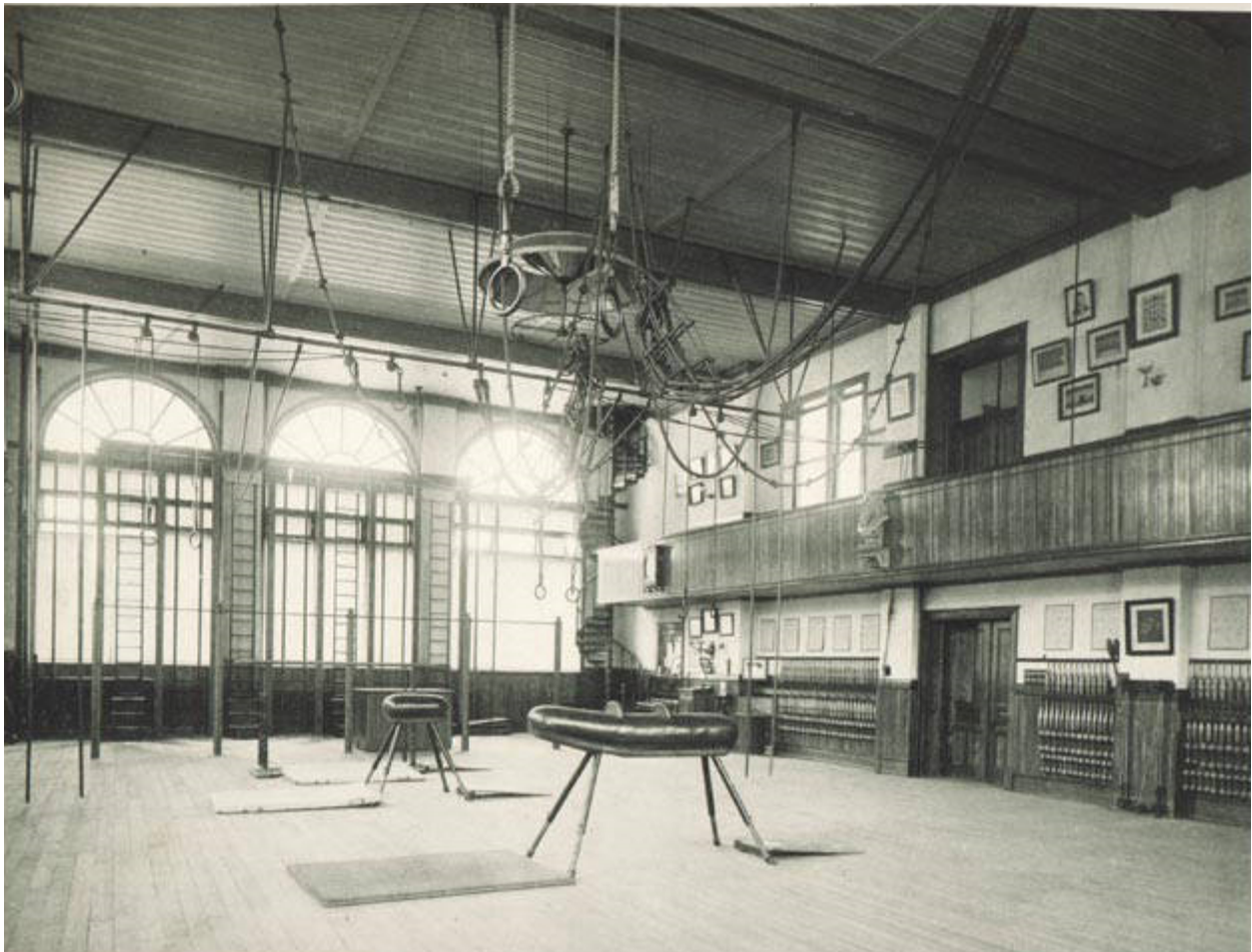

The use of the "Live Stock" pavilion was granted to Bund at intervals from May 17th to August 17th. The best athletes in this organization, from all over the country, gave twice weekly exhibitions. The program included exhibitions of military drilling and tumbling,

trapeze performing, boxing, wrestling, turning, horizontal bar and ring-work - everything, in fact, in the Association's curriculum.

The pavilion accommodated about 25,000 people. The officers of the Turner Bund were granted full control of physical culture in the Children's building. For a period of six weeks in the building, they conducted a physical culture school, where the system of imparting the methods to teachers was shown.

The use of the Music Hall for four hours each month was used for the drill exercises of adults. The exhibit made in the Liberal Arts department consisted of apparatus used in the gymnasium and charts and statistics of the work accomplished by the organization.
